

Nova Scotia Examination: Mathematics 10
2025–2026 Semester 2 Key Information & Resources

Overview: The Nova Scotia Examination: Mathematics 10 is written in one two-hour session on June 23, 2026. As in the past, the examination consists of a multiple-choice section and a constructed response section. The number of questions has been adjusted to fit the two-hour time slot.

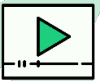
The NSE: Mathematics 10 is scored by course teachers using the provided Scoring Guide. The examination represents 20% of the final course grade.

Adaptations: Any adaptations provided to a student during the examination must have been provided to the student throughout the course, must be documented in TIENET, and must not compromise the validity of the examination. Refer to the NSE Mathematics 10 Information Guide for further details.

The examination will not be scored provincially. ◦ Examination materials must not be returned to the Department of Education and Early Childhood Development. Schools are required to retain and secure all materials for a minimum of one year, or longer in accordance with regional retention policies, before securely disposing of them.
